We were delighted this week to hear confirmation that we have achieved the prestigious Primary Science Quality Mark, led by University of Hertfordshire and the Primary Science Teaching Trust. Primary Science Quality Marks are awarded to infant, junior, primary schools to celebrate their commitment to excellence in science teaching and learning. So far, since its national launch in 2010, over 5000 schools across the UK have achieved the award. Through achieving the award, science will be developed further in the way it is planned and taught across the whole school.

"....Primary schools have an important role to ensure that children understand how science works and keeps us and our planet healthy and safe. Schools that have achieved a Primary Science Quality Mark have demonstrated a significant commitment to science teaching and learning. Children are engaging with great science both in and outside the classroom, developing positive attitudes towards science as well as secure scientific understanding and skills. Science subject leaders, their colleagues, head teachers, children, parents and governors should be very proud."

As Headteacher, I am very proud of this award. I would like to thank Miss Antoniazzi for all her hard work in developing Science across the school and for gaining national recognition.

It was a pleasure to meet our Community Support Officers this morning. They have been taking time to introduce themselves to all the schools in the area, to build good working relationships within the local community. They are keen to support us in whatever we might need, including leading assemblies and workshops.

We are reviewing the extra-curricular club programme, where clubs will continue, and we hope to offer some additional activities. More information will be available in the coming weeks.

Do you have a child born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019?

If so, you will need to apply for a place in a reception class in September 2023 for that child by the deadline of 15 January 2023.

Please note: you will need to apply even if your child attends a school's nursery or pre-school class. If a school is oversubscribed the fact that a child attends a school's nursery or pre-school, or a local nursery or pre-school, does not automatically guarantee a place at that school.
