Year 4 Eden trip: This week the Year 4's visited the biomes at Eden Project. They have been learning all about the rainforest biome as part of their Geography unit of learning. We went to experience the plants, climate and conditions in the rainforest biomes. The purpose of the trip was to get a greater understanding of what it's like living in the rainforest.

Swimming: Year 6 pupils have now completed their swimming lessons for this half term. It is pleasing to see the progress pupils make in such a short space of time, with some pupils overcoming their fear of water. Next half term year 5 will be swimming instead.

Clubs: It was encouraging to receive such quick responses to our club offers for next term, and we are pleased that so many of you that are keen to make the most of our extra-curricular provision. We are able to offer alternative clubs, and I am personally looking forward to meeting my Key stage 1 dancers, on a Tuesday.

Black History Month: This week saw the continuation of Black History Month. In assemblies, pupils across the school have been learning about the importance of the annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and recognizing their central role in history. This week pupils learnt about Mary Seacole the Jamaican businesswoman who was an inspiring role model because she broke social rules and prejudices to travel the world and help those in need – even in the most dangerous of places. Most notably, she provided food and care for British soldiers at the battlefront during the Crimean War.

Parent Consultations: It was good to welcome parents/carers to the school this week. When looking through the children's books, I was impressed with the range of learning and high expectations set across the school. I have also heard lots of positive comments regarding pupils' behaviour, which is a credit to both themselves and the parent/carers. Parental involvement can make a significant positive impact on the progress that children make, so thank you for all your continued support and interest in your child's learning.

Reception class meeting: We held a Reception class meeting at the beginning of the week. This was an opportunity to explain our phonics approach to parents/carers. The teaching of reading has progressed since many of us were at school, and this was highlighted in the session. Reception parents were taught the importance of the 'pure' sounds and how to 'Fred talk' to read a word. It proved we are never too old to learn! Teachers also shared the important role parents play in supporting their child at home, and in developing an early love of reading. Research shows that reading is a key indicator of success later in life, and at Pencoys we want to give all children the best start.

School council: Last week, in our Friday assembly, Year 6 members of the school council presented their ideas for school improvement. These were agreed in their previous meetings. This week, in true democratic style, they have held a whole school ballot. The result of their ballot was to fundraise towards more school trips. I look forward to hearing their fundraising ideas.

PTA: My thanks to the PTA, Mr Buck and Mrs Wilkes, for organising the Halloween costume sale and Halloween disco this half term. This is always such a fun event and thank you for everyone's efforts in creating such a spooky disco. I look forward to seeing the results of the pumpkin carving competition after half term.
