#### Focus for the Week: The Christmas Truce 1914

Our focus for this week was on the powerful Christmas message of peace and good will towards all people. We reflected on a photograph taken from the trenches in WW1, on Christmas day 1914, during the middle of a terrible war. We discussed how the soldiers were feeling and the remarkable effects of the classic song Silent Night. How despite the British troops fighting, how much they had in common with the men they were fighting and that people on the two sides of the front line were not so different...We learnt can learn from the Christmas Truce that the Christmas story is so powerful it can stop a war in its tracks - even if only briefly - and that the things that unite us as human beings are stronger than the things which divide us. We were reminded to help treat others with kindness and respect, to share with them and to never forget that we are all human.
